Studenti pěti evropských zemí zde stráví týden, svůj pobyt zahájili návštěvou kostelní věže

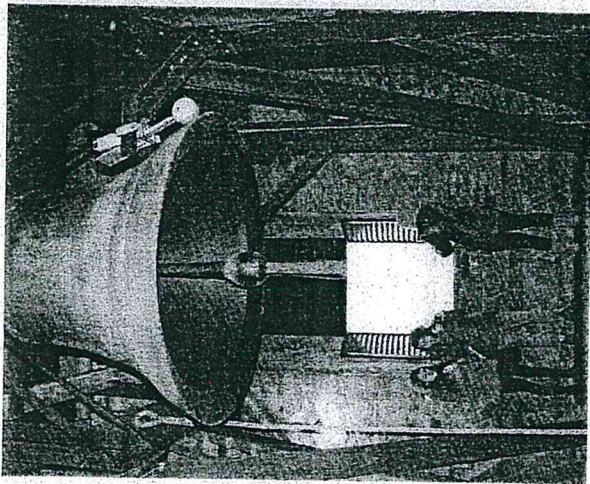

Karviná – Zkusit rozhoupat srdeč největšího zvonu ve zvonici kostela Povýšení sv. Kříže mohli při prohlídce města studenti z Bulharska, Turecka, Portugalska, Itálie a Lotyšska, kteří do Karviné přijeli na setkání v rámci programu Erasmus+.

Hosťtejskou školou je Střední odborná škola ochranných osob a majetku, která je do dvouletého programu zapojena. „Každou zemi vždy navštíví 25 studentů. S těmi nám a dvě nás ještě čekají,“ říká koordinátorka projektu Alexandra Florková, která nepochybuje o jeho úspěšnosti.

„Pro studenty je to obrovská zkušenost. Tím, že bydlí v rodinách, jim nezbývá nic jiného, než mluvit anglicky, i když se v hodinách angličtiny třeba moc nezapojují,“ vysvětluje Florková.

Foreign students rang on Frystak bells

The students from the five European countries are going to spend one week there. Their visit they have started from the attendance of the church tower.

Karvina - students from Bulgaria, Turkey, Portugal, Italy, Latvia, who are visiting Karvina now in the framework of the Erasmus + program, had the opportunity to swing the heart of of the biggest bell of Church of the Holy Cross in Karvina while searching the city.

The host school is the Secondary school of person and property protection, Ltd, which is involved into a program. "25 students will visit all the five countries, our students have already visited four of them and one more are waiting next year," Alexandra Florková, the coordinator of the project, says. And she is sure in its usefulness.

"There is a big experience for the students. The fact, that they are living in the families gives them only one opportunity to speak only one language - English, even though, when they do not active in their English lessons," - explains Florková.

"One week in the foreign-language household gives us more than English lessons during the whole year," say the students, who have the opportunity to visit the church in Fryšták. A local bell-ringer told not only about the history of the bell and the church, but the whole city in general. The students have learned, due to what occasions the necessary bell's sound rings; also they had the opportunity to ring on the 400 years old bell, also by the help of their own hands to swing the heart of the biggest bell, which sound continues to peal for two minutes after stopping.

And do the students like being here? "We are here just the second day. Things that we have already searched, I liked, but it is cold here too much," said the Turkish student Hakan Bas, while standing on the top of the tower, when the wind was blowing.

After visiting the church all the students continued sightseeing to another Church of St. Peter from Alkantara. The following days they are going to visit Ostravar brewery, The Science and Technology Center in Ostrava or Christmas Markets in Olomouc.

The students had the opportunity to enjoy the view of the city from the tower.
